AUSA PPI Benchmarking Survey 2008

Thirty three (33) Australian Universities, 7 New Zealand Universities and 1 Commonwealth agency participated in the 2008 AUSA positive performance indicator benchmarking survey.

Like the previous surveys in 2004 and 2006 this was a self assessment based on AS/NZS 4801:2001. The question set (5 sections, 35 questions) remained the same as that used in 2006 to allow a direct and meaningful comparison between the 2008 and 2006 results. Participating agencies were provided with the 2008 average scores from their State or Country and from the overall survey to compare

The results will also be shown from the best practice survey conducted in July 2008 (based on the seven lowest scored questions from the 2006 survey). Mike will showcase how Edith Cowan University has used these surveys to develop and implement strategies to improve their OHS system and processes, which has helped them

to progressively increase their scores and ranking with each survey.
